Abstract

The article is devoted to the topical issues of socio-economic inequality, poverty and hunger. It is revealed that poverty and food security are linked by cyclical dependence: poverty can lead to the lack of food security, as people may lack the financial means to access sufficient quantities of nutritious foods, and vice versa. It was determined that at present in Russia there is a high differentiation of regions by economic and social indicators, about 10% of the country's population is below the poverty line and the fund ratio is 13.8.
