

Rules for the design of a scientific article for the journal «Market Economy Problems»

1. The volume of the finished article should be at least 5 (only the text of the article) and no more than 35 pages. The average volume of articles is 15-20 pages (35,000 – 45,000 characters), including an abstract, keywords, and a list of references in Russian and English.

The team of authors of articles accepted for consideration cannot number more than 3 authors. As an exception, by the decision of the editor-in-chief, articles written by 4 authors can be considered.

Before sending an article to the editorial office, the author should take one of the articles of the latest issue of the journal as a design sample. The article should be written in grammatically verified Russian or English, in a clear style of presentation.

The author of the article is responsible for the accuracy of reproducing names, quotations, formulas, data, as well as references to sources used in the article.

2. General rules of registration

- Typing is done using Microsoft Word for Windows.
- Text editor parameters: all fields are **2.5 cm** long.
- Times **New Roman font**, size – **11**.
- Line spacing – **1**.
- Width alignment.
- Paragraph indentation of **1 cm**.
- The orientation of the sheet is portrait.
- Page numbers are indicated at the bottom in the center of the page.
- The main type of quotation marks: « ».
- Without automatic hyphenation.
- The use of automatic paginated links is allowed.
- All abbreviations and abbreviations must be deciphered at their first mention in the text.
- Font selections in the text of the article in italics or bold are allowed.
- The headings of the article and its sections are given in bold. They start with uppercase and continue with lowercase letters (do not put a dot at the end).
- Scanned versions of figures, tables and formulas are not allowed.
- All Figures and Tables should be numbered and provided with titles or captions (see below for an example of design).

Tables and Figures are always placed in the text after the reference to them (table 1, fig. 1).

In tables, the Name is placed on top, and the *Source* is placed under the table, in figures, the Name and *Source* are after the figure. All tables and figures must have a link to the source (if the table or figure is borrowed) or signed «Figure (table) compiled by the author(s)».

Drawings should be provided in a format that allows editing and modification without contacting the author.

Objects in drawings created with the help of various graphic tools MS Word, etc., should be grouped as a single object. **The anchor** is not applied (the position of the figure is in the text).

Drawings should be extremely visual, graphically expressive, clear. The lines should be clear, without shadows, the text in the drawings is readable. Drawings should not be copies or scans from

any other sources. Numbering and names of drawings are mandatory for all drawings (you do not need to specify the name in the field of the drawing itself).

– **Graphs, diagrams, diagrams when submitting an article should be accompanied by an Excel file (the file must contain the original numerical data associated with the drawing).**

– **Drawings are also provided with accompanying files in JPG format, with the names «figure-N.jpg», with a resolution of at least 300 dpi.**

• **Formulas.** Formulas are numbered on the right edge. All formulas must be numbered. Formulas are drawn up in the MS Equation or MathType editor with the ability to edit them. It is unacceptable to use automatic numbering of formulas and cross-references to formulas or references in the text of the article.

• **The list of References** is given at the end of the article (after the main text) and should contain at least 15 – 50 sources. It is important that the authors take into account foreign studies when preparing the publication (including foreign ones – at least 30%). Self-citation – no more than 10%.

When compiling a list of references, it is necessary to carefully check the correctness of the bibliographic information of the cited sources, especially the output data (journal name, year, number, pages) and include in the description of the DOI of the article, if available. It is advisable to take the names of the authors, the titles of articles and the names of journals directly from the primary sources. All should be given without abbreviations, observing their exact description. These sources must have a clear authorship, be easily detected by search engines (Google, Yandex, Bing, etc.).

The list includes only publications that are mentioned in the text of the article. Russian publications are listed in alphabetical order (automatic numbered list is not used) – first publications in Russian, then foreign sources; all publications in Russian must be accompanied by an English translation enclosed in square brackets.

The list of references in Russian and English is drawn up in accordance with **Rules for the design of the list of References.**

3. The main design of the article:

- **At the beginning of the article, the classifier codes are indicated:**

UDC:

JEL: (width alignment, no indentation, all uppercase, font 10, bold).

- Separated by a space – The title design in Russian: **The title of the article** (alignment in the center of the line, no indentation, case – As in the sentence, font 14, bold);
- Separated by a space – ***F.P.S.*** (**full name of the author of the article** (centered, font 11, italics, bold), academic degree, academic title (font 11, regular);
- On the following lines (font 11, italics, center alignment)

If there are several authors of the article, then the information is repeated for each author, separated by a space.

- After 1 space

For citation:

Surname of the acting author(s) Title of the article // Market economy problems. – a year. – No. – Pp. (width alignment, indent 1, font 11, normal)

DOI:

- After 1 space
- **Abstract in Russian** no more than 2000 characters (counting with spaces) (alignment – indentation on the left and right 1, there is no paragraph indentation, font 11)

- After 1 space

Keywords: up to 10 words and expressions, separated from each other by a comma (with a dot at the end of the enumeration, font 11, italics, alignment – indentation on the left and right 1, there is no paragraph indentation).

- After 1 space

With the support of ... (the article was prepared within the framework of ...) (font 11, italics, alignment – indentation on the left and right 1, there is no paragraph indentation).

- After 1 space

The information is repeated in English (it is also issued as the Russian version) – **Title, For citation, Abstract, Keywords.**

Please note the name of the magazine in English – **Market economy problems**. The name of the **Market Economy Institute** in English is **Market Economy Institute of Russian Academy of Sciences (MEI RAS)**.

- After 1 space – the text of the article (font 11, normal, paragraph indentation 1)

The text of the scientific article should be structured with the allocation of sections and subsections. The sections **Introduction** (the first section at the beginning of the article) and **Conclusions** (the last section of the main text) are mandatory. In the main part, sections and subsections should reflect the essence of logically constructed sections of the article (at the discretion of the author).

The use of IMRAD structure to present the results of the study (Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results, Discussion, Conclusions) is welcomed. For experimental studies, sections «Recommendations» and/or «Practical application» can be added).

Conclusions are a systematic result of the study. It is necessary to observe the main principle: to go from particular to more general and important provisions. A typical mistake when writing conclusions is listing what has been done in the work and has already been described in the previous sections. It is necessary to present the main conclusions on the results obtained in a logical sequence, indicate the possibility of their implementation in practice, and determine further prospects for working on the topic. Tables, figures, formulas are not placed in the conclusions, only in the main text.

Appendices are not provided in the articles.

- After 1 space – **Литература / References**, the list of references is given in alphabetical order, with through numbering, at the beginning of the sources in Russian, then in English (font 11, normal, indent 1) (**see the Rules for the design of the list of References**). When making a list of references, it is recommended to pay attention and taking into account all the details (intervals, punctuation marks, capital letters, italics, etc.).

References in the text to the corresponding source from the list of references are made in parentheses (**see the Rules for the design of links in the text of the article**).

It is advisable not to include anonymous sources (without authorship), articles from any non-scientific sources, as well as literature of insignificant volume (0.5-1 page) in the list of References.

Regulatory legal acts are indicated first. Then scientific sources, textbooks and links to Internet resources are added.

The order of sorting of literature sources:

- International regulations.
- The Constitution of the Russian Federation.
- Regulatory and legal documents.
 - Federal constitutional laws.
 - Delivery of the Constitutional Court.
 - Codes
 - Federal laws
 - Laws
 - Decrees of the President of the Russian Federation.
 - Acts of the Government

- Resolutions.
- Orders.
- Acts of the Supreme and Supreme Arbitration Courts
- Regulations of ministries and departments
 - Regulations.
 - Orders.
 - Orders.
 - Letters.
- Regional regulations.
- GOST standards.
- SNIps, SP, ENIRs, TU.
- Books, articles, textbooks, monographs, electronic sources (links from the Internet).
- Foreign sources.

1. After 1 space – About the **author(s)** (in Russian)
(center alignment, font 11, normal, bold);

2. After 1 space – *Full name* (in full, italics), academic degree, academic title, position, place of work, city (font 11, normal) (width alignment, indent 1)

3. After 1 space – **About author(s)** (in English)
(center alignment, font 11, normal, bold);

4. After 1 space – in English: *F.P.S.* (full name and surname, italics), academic degree, academic title, position, place of work, city (font 11, normal) (width alignment, indent 1)

Please note:

The dot is not placed after: headings, article titles, headings and subheadings, table titles, figures.

The dot is placed after: abbreviations (month – month, year – year, million – million, billion – billion, dollars – dollar, F. art. – pound sterling, thousand – thousand), XX century, 1985-1990, but the 1990s (not the 1990s), cubic meters (not m3)

The dash is entered by a combination of Ctrl and «gray minus» keys or using autocorrect.

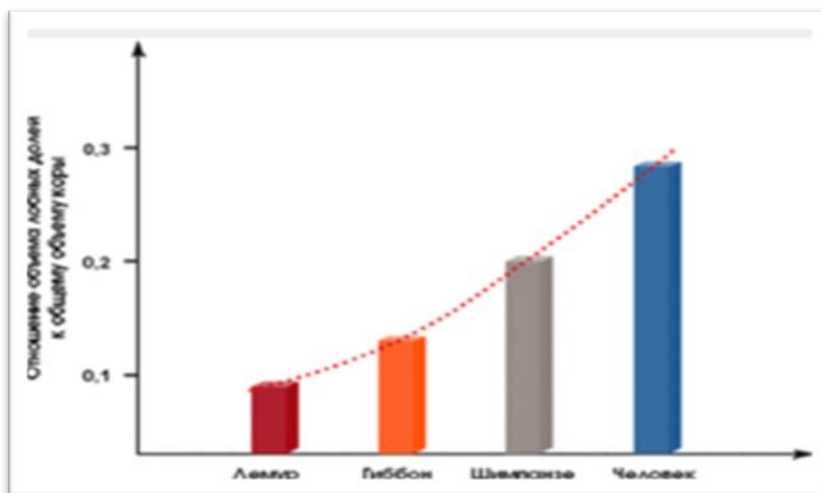


Рис. 1. / Fig. 1. The name of the picture / The name of the picture in English (Font 11, normal, centered alignment, no dot at the end)
